



# POST GRADUATE COURSE IN VETERINARY HOMEOPATHY

The first course in veterinary homeopathy to be offered in South Africa which leads to an internationally recognized qualification – the Vet MF Hom (Veterinary Member of the Faculty of Homeopathy)

The course is accredited by the Faculty of Homeopathy (London) and the International Association for Veterinary Homeopathy. The Vet MF Hom. qualification is recognized by the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

## Format

The course consists of two four-day modules per year for three years, followed by the opportunity to sit the Vet MF Hom exam. There is the option to complete the first year only and sit a primary health-care exam which, if successful, confers the title of Licentiate of the Faculty ( Vet LF Hom.). This enables prescribing for acute uncomplicated cases.

## When:

The first module will be held from 25 – 28 May 2005 with the second module provisionally scheduled for November 2005.

## Where:

The venue has yet to be finalized but will probably be in the Johannesburg area. Venues will differ with each module so that the same attendees do not have to travel each time.

### Lecturers:

Course lecturers will be Dr Peter Gregory, who gave a series of introductory lectures in May 2004, and Dr John Saxton. Both lecturers have an abundance of teaching and clinical experience.

## Content:

The module format will be three days of lectures with the fourth day covering live and video case studies which will illustrate what has been discussed in the previous three days. Integrated home study and e-

mail tutor support ensure continuous skills development between modules.

## The first module will cover:

- \* History of homeopathy
- \* Materia medicas and repertories; an introduction to repertorisation.
- \* Homeopathic pharmacy
- \* Use of homeopathy in first aid and acute prescribing
- \* Practical case taking
- \* The concept of the constitution
- \* Materia medica of four major homeopathic medicines
- \* Live case studies.

Those interested should book as soon as possible to be sure of securing a place.

Cost of each module will be divided into two parts. A fee of 450 pounds will be payable directly to the HPTG for the lecturers and

course notes.

A fee will also be required for venue costs and refreshments, which will be finalized in due course.
